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UNEMPLOYED

Unemployment in the EU and the euro area. Eurostat estimates that about 14 million men and women in the EU, of whom 12,01 million in the euro area (EA), were unemployed in September 2021. The phenomenon of unemployment is examined in a number of scientific disciplines, for example, in economics, psychology, or social policy.

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For migrant people living in poverty, strengthening their entrepreneurial and innovative skills for self-employment are valuable opportunities that will contribute to poverty reduction.



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From the perspective of economic theory there are two dimensions of unemployment - microeconomic and macroeconomic. From a microeconomic perspective, unemployment affects not only the individual, who lost a job, thereby limits his revenue, but it also means the overall reduction in the standard of living for the whole family. Unemployed people have the material, but also the social problems.
